Respirators

Air-purifying respirators protect the wearer from breathing in airborne hazardous contaminants. As they are able to filter both large and small particles, respirators are an effective form of respiratory protection. Before they are approved for use, they undergo rigorous safety tests to ensure the effectiveness of the product, including the efficiency of the filter.

Respirators can be reusable or disposable, and are required in certain work settings based on each workplace's OSHA requirements, primarily in warehouses or other settings where workers are exposed to hazardous materials. Even higher levels of protection are provided by powered airpurifying and supplied air respirators.

Surgical Masks

Medical or surgical masks act as a protective barrier to prevent particles and droplets from entering the wearer's mouth and nose. They also help prevent the wearer from spreading respiratory droplets – however, they do not prevent smaller airborne particles from penetrating, and also do not guarantee a seal to the face to prevent contaminants from entering any gaps. Surgical masks are disposable and intended for one-time use.

Surgical masks are used regularly in hospitals and doctor's offices, where contact with many people throughout the day necessitates changing safety equipment often.

Cloth Masks

Most cloth masks, whether homemade or store-bought, do not provide protection for the wearer from being exposed to illness, but they can be effective at containing the wearer's respiratory droplets. Additionally, some specialized cloth masks contain one or more layers of filter media that may provide greater protection for the wearer than traditional cloth masks. Depending on your work environment, employees may need to change their cloth mask during a shift if they become wet, soiled or contaminated in any way. Most cloth masks are reusable and machine washable.

Cloth masks are an option for everyday use in environments where close contact with other people is minimal, such as certain office spaces.



FACE SHIELDS

Face shields are primarily used for eye protection and consist of a clear plastic barrier that wraps around the sides of the wearer's face and extend below the chin. Frequent sanitization is key to wearing a face shield, and disposable face shields should be discarded after their first use.

The CDC does not recommend the use of a face shield as a replacement for wearing a mask – employing both together will be more effective, but both may not be necessary in some work environments. However, wearing a face shield may be an option for those who are deaf or hard of hearing as well as those who interact with hearing-impaired people, as a face shield can be a helpful tool to more easily communicate.



EYEWEAR

As droplets can infect through the eyes, it may be appropriate in certain workplaces to utilize eyewear, specifically those where workers will encounter high volumes of contact with other people. Goggles and safety glasses that fit snugly to the face and don't have openings on the sides can provide a seal to prevent droplets from making contact with the eye area.





EARPLUG DISPENSER

The equipment your warehouse staff uses every day is essential – making it sanitary as well can help to slow the spread of disease while performing everyday job functions. Installing an earplug dispenser can be a way to distribute necessary PPE to your workers while reducing hand-to-hand contact.

SAFETY PACK

Safety packs containing disposable masks and alcohol wipes serve as a handy personal protection kit for employees and visitors alike. Place these at locations that have high people traffic such as main entrances, reception lobbies, meeting rooms, carpark entrances, etc.
